#### PALACE GARDENS


The Palace Gardens are generally flat but there are some steep slopes and drops from height in some areas.

There are uneven surfaces and gravel paths throughout the gardens, and there are several ponds; please be careful near water.

Smooth tarmac paths are available in The Wilderness, Rose Garden and Kitchen Garden.

The Maze has narrow paths and 2-metre-high hedges. The paths inside are only 1 metre wide.




