Foreword

Research at Historic Royal Palaces (HRP) takes many forms. From the history of our unique palaces and the people who lived and worked in them to world-renowned conservation science and innovative public engagement methodologies, Historic Royal Palaces leads and collaborates on a wide variety of research projects with academic, cultural and industry partners. Innovative original research underpins everything that we do as part of our charitable purpose to look after, interpret, and engage audiences with the buildings, landscapes, and collections in our care.

The Annual Research Report (ARR) 2022-2023, collates and celebrates a broad range of research outputs created by staff working across the organisation, our collaborative doctoral partnership and doctoral training partnership students and our postdoctoral research associates. As an organisation we are still dealing with the legacy of the Covid-19 pandemic and balancing the demands of conducting business-as-usual with less capacity alongside having the time to conduct and disseminate research. As an Independent Research Organisation (IRO), research is at the core of our ambition to inform the world class conservation and interpretation we deliver for all our sites. This year has seen HRP's Research Strategy 2022-2027 being put into practice. This strategy supports four crosscutting priority research themes, 'Identities and Perceptions', 'Materiality and Environment', 'Inclusivity and Diverse Heritages' and 'Interactions and Relationships'. By developing research that supports these themes we ensure that our research aligns with the strategic aims of the organisation and our broader ambitions to ensure that HRP is a 'Charity for Everyone'.

This is the eighth report since HRP's successful application for Independent Research Organisation (IRO) status in 2014. As an IRO, HRP is expanding its ambition to apply for research funding and becoming increasingly successful. Research is becoming embedded in the culture of HRP, which is evidenced by staff from across the organisation who share research at and regularly attend the monthly Research Seminars. Our collaborative doctoral partnership and doctoral training partnership students, postdoctoral research associates and doctoral placement students add to the growing research culture, as they share their research through articles and blogs and undertake placements across the organisation. A diverse range of research outputs are being produced by staff from a variety of departments across HRP, recognising the ways in which research informs, for example, HRP's public engagement and education offer.

This report showcases a broad range of research and celebrates our commitment to growing research in all its forms, Arts and Humanities Research Council (AHRC) funded research grants, research-informed public talks, research that supports exhibition displays, and research events. The report shows our commitment to making HRP a centre of research excellence, and to expanding our growing portfolio of research projects and collaborators.



Executive Summary and Strategic Background

The ARR 2022-23 outlines research activity from across the entire organisation from October 2022 to September 2023.

Despite a reduced level of staff resource since Covid and coupled with a temporary change in management with Dr Marianne Wilson providing parental leave cover for Dr Laura Tompkins, HRP has successfully maintained a portfolio of research projects and this period remained one of extraordinary strategic success for HRP as an IRO. The impressive array of both academic and public engagement outputs, through peer-reviewed articles, chapters, newspaper articles, podcasts, blogs, academic lectures and public talks, are testament to HRP's growth as an IRO and increase its research credibility as well as its national and international research reputation.*

Collaboration is a core objective outlined in the HRP Research Strategy, and as many similar organisations emerge from the pandemic, it has never been more important to grow networks and facilitate knowledge exchange by developing projects with new and existing partners across the heritage, university, and industry sectors. HRP supports knowledge exchange at all levels, whether through leading UKRI and other grant-funded projects, such as *Henry VIII on Tour* and the analysis of the remains in the Chapel of Saint Peter ad Vincula; facilitating research seminars and symposiums for sector professionals, such as the Annual Heritage Science for Historic House Collections Research Seminar, hosted by HRP in collaboration with English Heritage and the National Trust; or nurturing and training the next generation. HRP's educational remit continues to thrive with an ever-expanding cohort of students in the MA in Heritage Management with QMUL as well as PhD students undertaking collaborative doctoral awards with us.

This report is testament to the extraordinary endeavour of HRP research staff in their specialist fields and the desire to demonstrate that now, more than ever, the fundamental importance of this work in fulfilling our charitable purpose and furthering our strategic goals. The input, guidance, and expertise of the members of Research Strategy Board (RSB) is invaluable in supporting HRP's research activities and will be crucial looking ahead to our future plans for HRP as an IRO.

Highlights, 2022-2023

2022-2023 has been a momentous period in our own contemporary royal history, as we witnessed the death of the late Queen and the coronation of King Charles III. It is a testament to their expertise in the history of monarchy that Tracy Borman and Charles Farris made public appearances to comment and reflect on these historic events amid a resurgence of popular interest in royal rites of passage.

Reflecting its IRO status, HRP has continued to push the boundaries of research. On the back of a successful AHRC grant application, *Henry VIII on Tour: Landscape, Communities and Performance* continues apace, led by Anthony Musson in partnership with a cross-disciplinary team from the University of York and the University of Liverpool, as they draw on archival sources, architecture, archaeology, music and material culture to reconceptualise Henry VIII's progresses. There is further development too, with plans in 2024 to create a multi-sensory recreation of a royal progress through across the southwest.

In collaboration with the University of Cardiff, Historic England, and the Chapel of Saint Peter ad Vincula, Alfred Hawkins also successfully led a LAMAS grant that enabled a radiocarbon and isotopic analysis and full osteological reassessment of the skeletal remains exhumed from outside the Chapel of Saint Peter ad Vincula in 2019.

Key highlights onsite include the *Crown to Couture* exhibition at Kensington Palace, curated by Polly Putnam and Claudia Acott Williams, which emphasised the spectacular connections between Georgian court dress and celebrity fashion in the 21st century. As well as attracting record numbers of visitors, this hugely successful exhibition also resulted in

significant research outputs, including *Crown* to *Couture: The Magazine* (2023) edited by Polly Putnam and Claudia Acott Williams, as well as public talks, research seminar papers, and blog articles.

Another crowning achievement is the new permanent exhibition at the Tower of London, *The Crown Jewels*, curated by Charles Farris, which attracted particular interest with the coronation of a new monarch and resulted in TV broadcasts, radio interviews, newspaper articles, and keynote presentations.

As part of its ongoing commitment to exploring diverse stories, HRP is proud to have hosted the *Permissible Beauty* film and installation. Led by Matthew Storey in collaboration with the Research Centre for Museums and Galleries (University of Leicester), The National Trust, and English Heritage, the installation took inspiration from the 'Hampton Court Beauties' to create new portraits of British Black Queer creatives.

As a founding member of the Queer Heritage Collections Network (QHCN), HRP is delighted that the Network has been awarded funding from the Arts Council England to achieve a step change in its work to help GLAM organisations become world-leading in using their collections to increase understanding of and access to LGBTIAQ+ heritage.

Education underpins a core element of HRP's work as an IRO both through the popular MA in Heritage Management, led by John Davis in collaboration with Queen Mary University, as well as its ever-expanding cohort of collaborative doctoral students.

The planned symposium is scheduled for 12 January 2024 and will be held at the Royal Maritime Museum in Greenwich.
